2. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/THOROUGHBRED RACING RULE, 178 CSR 1
 - A. Amendments to 178 CSR 1 to incorporate the RCI Controlled Therapeutic Medication Schedule, Version 2.1 (Revised April 17, 2014).
 - B. Amendments to the Uniform Classification Guidelines for Foreign Substances (currently Table D in the Thoroughbred Racing Rule, 178 CSR 1), to conform with the current version of the Guidelines (Version 7.00) published by RCI.
 - C. Amendments to 178 CSR 1, to incorporate the RCI Model Rule on Multiple Medication Violations.
 - D. Amendments to 178 CSR 1, § 8.5.g.2. to require the stewards, before assessing a fine against a permit holder, to make written findings as to: the reprehensibility of the rule violation; the actual damages caused by the permit holder; and, the relative severity of other penalties. And, further to amend the section to limit the stewards' fine authority to the "Racing Commission's enforcement costs," not to exceed \$100,000.00. – Maria Catagnani, CTHBPA
 - E. Amendments to 178 CSR 1, § 21.1.c. to indicate that the association acts in a "fiduciary" capacity in ensuring that all purse monies, disbursements and nomination race monies are available for timely distribution. – Maria Catagnani, CTHBPA
 - F. Amendments to 178 CSR 1 to require that the association shall mitigate noise from trucks and cars in excess of 80 decibels at training tracks. – Maria Catagnani, CTHBPA
 - G. Amendments to 178 CSR 1 to require that the association provide adequate lighting at training tracks. – Maria Catagnani, CTHBPA
 - H. Amendments to 178 CSR 1, § 50.3.k., to require that all specimens taken from horses for testing be shipped to the testing lab within twenty-four hours of the specimen's collection. – Maria Catagnani, CTHBPA
 - I. Amendments to the 178 CSR 1 to require cameras in the test barns. – Phillip Heidenreich, MPHBP

J. Amendments to 178 CSR 1 to allow horsemen with a valid permit in another jurisdiction on the backside to transport horses and to require horsemen to obtain such a permit prior to the appropriate race. – Phillip Heidenreich, MPHBP
