On March 11, 2016, the Board of Stewards offered a hearing to Owner/Trainer, James L. Williams to which he waived his right to a hearing regarding the allegations set forth in Notice of Hearing issued.

After considering the evidence, the Stewards hereby find the following:

The official blood sample #193263 taken on 2/25/2016 was reported by Industrial Laboratories, official testing Laboratory, to contain Phenylbutazone above the authorized levels. Specifically, blood sample contained 2.9 ug/ml.

The sample was taken from "Son of a John" which ran in the First Race on 2/25/16 finishing sixth. This horse is a DkB/Br.g.4 Colonel John-Carlson's Queen by Lord Carson - Bred in KY.

Mr. Williams elected to waive his right to the split sample testing.

The Stewards conclude that James L. Williams has violated section(s) **178-1-51.1**.a which reads, "The Trainer is absolute insurer of and responsible for the condition of the horses he or a race, regardless of the acts of third parties. If testing or analysis of urine, blood or other bodily substances or tissues prove positive showing the presence of any prohibited drug, medication or substance, the trainer of the horse may be fined, suspended, have his or her occupational permit revoked, be prohibited access to all grounds under the jurisdiction of the Racing Commission, or may be otherwise disciplined. In addition, the owner of the horse, the foreman in charge of the horse, the groom and any other person shown to have had the care, or attendance of the horse may be fined, suspended, have his or her occupational permit revoked, be prohibited access to all grounds under the jurisdiction of the Racing Commission, or may be otherwise disciplined."

In addition, because the permit holder has accumulated "0" points prior to this ruling and "1" point in connection with this ruling for a current total of "1" point, under the multiple medication violation point system, he/she is subject to an additional penalty of "NA" points pursuant to section 49.3.m.6. of 178 W. Va.C.S.R.1. This penalty is in addition to the penalty imposed by the stewards for the underlying offense.

This medication/prohibited substance violation is his first offense for Phenylbutazone.

On June 15, 2016, the Board of Stewards conducted a hearing regarding allegations set forth in a Notice of Hearing issued on June 4, 2016. Jose S. Nunez and Madeline Huis were present in person and testified before the Board of Stewards. After considering the evidence, the Board of Stewards hereby find the following:

The official blood and urine samples # E193429 taken on March 19, 2016 were reported by Industrial Laboratories to contain N-ethylnicotinamide, the metabolite of Nikethamide. Pursuant to Table 178-1 D of the Thoroughbred Racing Rule, 178 C.S.R. 1, Nikethamide is a Class 1 Drug, carrying a Category A penalty. The samples were taken from "Road Agent", which ran in the RACE NUMBER 7 on March 19, 2016, finishing 1st. The horse is trained by Jose S. Nunez and owned by Madeline Huis.

After notification to you, you elected to conduct split sample testing on the blood collected for "Road Agent" and selected Texas A&M Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory to conduct the split sample testing. After events beyond the control of the Racing Commission caused the split blood sample not to be received by Texas A&M, you were contacted by the Stewards to make arrangements to continue to fulfill and honor your request for split sample testing. Specifically, the Stewards required you to appear so that the split urine sample for "Road Agent" could be sent for testing to Texas A&M. After you failed to appear for the shipment of the split urine sample, the Stewards and a Racing Commission Veterinarian caused the split urine sample to be sent to Texas A&M, observing the appropriate chain of custody and in the presence of independent witnesses. In addition, the Stewards ordered Industrial to ship the remaining, untested and preserved blood in its possession to Texas A&M for testing. As a result of your failure to cooperate regarding the split sample testing, arrangements were made to have the West Virginia Racing Commission pay Texas A&M for conducting the split sample testing of the blood and urine.

On or about June 2, 2016, Texas A&M confirmed the presence of N-ethylnicotinamide, the metabolite of Nikethamide, in the urine split sample for "Road Agent" and in the remaining, untested and preserved blood sample for "Road Agent."

The official blood and urine samples # E193472.taken on March 26, 2016 were reported by Industrial Laboratories to contain N-ethylnicotinamide, the metabolite of Nikethamide. Pursuant to Table 178-1 D of the Thoroughbred Racing Rule, 178 C.S.R. 1, Nikethamide is a Class 1 Drug, carrying a Category A penalty. The samples were taken from "Grace Is a Beauty", which ran in the RACE NUMBER 6 on March 26, 2016, finishing 1st. The horse is trained by Jose S. Nunez and owned by Madeline Huis.

After notification to you, you elected to conduct split sample testing on the blood collected for "Grace Is a Beauty" and selected Texas A&M Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory to conduct the split sample testing. After events beyond the control of the Racing Commission caused the split blood sample not to be received by Texas A&M, you were contacted by the Stewards to make arrangements to continue to fulfill and honor your request for split sample testing. Specifically, the Stewards required you to appear so that the split urine sample for "Grace Is a Beauty" could be sent for testing to Texas A&M. After you failed to appear for the shipment of the split urine sample, the Stewards and a Racing Commission Veterinarian caused the split urine sample to be sent to Texas A&M, observing the appropriate chain of custody and in the presence of independent witnesses. In addition, the Stewards ordered Industrial to ship the remaining, untested and preserved blood in its possession to Texas A&M for testing. As a result of your failure to cooperate regarding the split sample testing, arrangements were made to have the West Virginia Racing Commission pay Texas A&M for conducting the split sample testing of the blood and urine.

On or about June 2, 2016, Texas A&M confirmed the presence of N-ethylnicotinamide, the metabolite of Nikethamide, in the urine split sample for "Grace Is a Beauty" and in the remaining, untested and preserved blood sample for "Grace Is a Beauty."

The Board of Stewards conclude that Jose Nunez has violated sections 49.4.a.1. and 51.1.a. of the Thoroughbred Racing Rule, 178 C.S.R. 1. Specifically, N-ethylnicotinamide, the metabolite of Nikethamide, confirmed to be present in "Road Agent's" body while it was participating in a race, is a drug or medication for which no acceptable threshold concentration has been established by the West Virginia Racing Commission. Therefore, the presence of N-ethylnicotinamide, the metabolite of Nikethamide, in "Road Agent" is a violation of 178 C.S.R. 1, § 49.4.a.1.

In addition, pursuant to section 51.1.a. of the Thoroughbred Racing Rule, 178 C.S.R. 1, as the trainer of "Road Agent," Jose Nunez is the absolute insurer of and responsible for the condition of the horse, regardless of the acts of third parties. Inasmuch the testing of urine and blood from "Road Agent" proved positive showing the presence of a prohibited drug, medication, or substance, Jose Nunez, as the trainer of the horse, may be fined, suspended, have his occupational permit revoked, be prohibited access to all grounds under the jurisdiction of the Racing Commission, or may be otherwise disciplined.

The medication/prohibited substance violation associated with the positive in "Road Agent" is Jose Nunez's **FIRST** offense for a drug carrying a Category A penalty. The Penalty Guidelines set forth in Table 178-1 E of the Thoroughbred Racing Rule provide a minimum penalty of a one (1) year suspension and a \$10,000.00 fine.

The medication/prohibited substance violation associated with the positive in "Grace Is a Beauty" is Jose Nunez's **SECOND** offense for a drug carrying a Category A penalty. The Penalty Guidelines set forth in Table 178-1 E of the Thoroughbred Racing Rule provide a minimum penalty of a three (3) year suspension and a \$25,000.00 fine.

An analysis of the mitigating/aggravating factors is as follows:

Mr. Nunez's past record as a permit holder is relatively good in that Mr. Nunez has had only two previous medication violations: a Phenylbutazone overage in Delaware on or about August 13, 2012 for which he was fined \$500.00, and a Diphenhydramine positive in Pennsylvania on or about September 19, 2014 for which he was fined \$1,500.00.

However, Nikethamide and its metabolite, found in "Road Agent" and "Grace Is a Beauty" is a Class 1 Drug. Pursuant to 178 C.S.R. 1, § 49.2.a., Class 1 drugs have no generally accepted medical use in the racehorse and their pharmacological potential for altering the performance of a race is very high. This is an aggravating factor.

It is also an aggravating factor that Nikethamide is not available on the legal, commercial market in the United States for human or veterinary use. Nikethamide is not FDA approved for use in the United States.

During the hearing neither Mr. Nunez nor Ms. Huis offered any explanation or information that would explain how Nikethamide, a very serious drug, got into "Road Agent" and "Grace Is a Beauty."

Weighing and balancing the aggravating and mitigating factors, the Board of Stewards finds that the minimum penalty for each offense is appropriate in this case. Therefore, the Stewards hereby impose the following penalties:

Mr. Nunez is hereby SUSPENDED for ONE (1) year and FINED \$10,000.00 for the first offense Class 1, Category A, drug positive in "Road Agent." Pursuant to 178 C.S.R. 1, § 49.3.m., Mr. Nunez is assessed SIX (6) POINTS under the Multiple Medication Violation rule for this violation. In addition, "Road Agent" is hereby placed on the Veterinarian's List for NINETY (90) days from the date of this ruling and must pass an examination before becoming eligible to be entered in a race. The purse of the race is ordered to be FORFEITED and "Road Agent" is DISQUALIFIED from its first place finish in the 7th race on March 19, 2016. The order of finish is hereby re-ordered as follows:

1st Blue Mountain Cat 2nd Gabbi's Amor 3rd Manewal 4th Graduated 5th Two More Jacs 6th Academy Run

Mr. Nunez is hereby SUSPENDED for THREE (3) years and FINED \$25,000.00 for the second offense Class 1, Category A, drug positive in "Grace Is a Beauty." Pursuant to 178 C.S.R. 1, § 49.3.m., Mr. Nunez is assessed SIX (6) POINTS under the Multiple Medication Violation rule for this violation. In addition, "Grace Is a Beauty" is hereby placed on the Veterinarian's List for ONE HUNDRED TWENTY (120) days from the date of this ruling and must pass an examination before becoming eligible to be entered in a race. The purse of the race is ordered to be FORFEITED and "Grace Is a Beauty" is DISQUALIFIED from its first place finish in the 6th race on March 26, 2016. The order of finish is hereby re-ordered as follows:

1st Early Glory 2nd Distinctlybella 3rd Linda's Lollipon 4th Prithee 5th Malibu Fever 6th Wawa

As a result of the accumulation of a total of **TWELVE (12) POINTS** under the Multiple Medication Violation rule for the above-listed violations, Mr. Nunez is hereby **SUSPENDED** an additional **THREE HUNDRED SIXTY (360)** days pursuant to 178 C.S.R. 1, § 49.3.m.6.
